Carpathia:

Built by Swan, Hunter & Wigham Richardson Limited, Newcastle, England, 1903. 13,603 gross tons; 558 (bp) feet long; 64 feet wide. Steam quadruple expansion engines, twin screw. Service speed 14 knots. 1,704 passengers (204 first class, 1,500 third class).One funnel, four masts, steel hull, three decks. Built for Cunard Line, British flag, in 1903 and named **Carpathia**. Liverpool-New York and Trieste-New York service. Rescued 705 survivors on April 15, 1912 from the sunken TITANIC. Torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine off the English coast in 1918.



He had become an apprentice in the dry goods business in England, working in London, Northampton and Reading. He decided to come to the U.S. while doing social settlement work in Northampton, when he met a couple, whose wife had lived in the U.S.

He worked at a dry goods store in Fairfield, Iowa. He attended Koster Window Trimming and Advertising School in Chicago. (RTC after Melton)

She came here after the Christmas holidays as special supervisor of Music in the public schools, filling the position with great efficiency.

Mr. Tearle is also an important factor in musical circles, possessing a cultivated tenor voice. He has been window decorator at the Rush for a year and a half, and has made him-self very popular in Cherryvale, as well as proved himself a successful young business man. Mr. Tearle's home is in Bedfordshire, England. He has leased the cottage at 501 East Sixth street where they will begin housekeeping soon.

Sam has no memories of Boonville other than farm related. I remember the drive to KC was shorter than the drive to the Boonville. Phoebe loves to remember telling me that she was going to fold me up in the Murphy bed at night.

Mary Louise Tearle continued to live and work in Kansas City as a sales clerk in Emery, Bird, Thayer & Company for many years. In the 1960's she became unable to care for herself and moved to Florissant (St. Louis County), MO, first to live with her daughter Frances, and later in a nursing home. She died July 2, 1968. (Social Security Death Index available)

Bonham & Frances Tearle Chancellor had three sons, Robert Tearle 1936, Sam Bonham 1940, and Stephen Monroe 1947. Marshal & Phoebe Tearle Kennedy had two daughters, Laura Shepardson (1948-2002) and Kristin 1951. All of the Chancellor & Kennedy kids married and produced offspring.
